Coniferous Trees: Although not native to our area, these trees can still provide water and air quality benefits, cover for wildlife and be used in windbreak establishments.	
Fir, Balsam: A slow-growing tree attaining a height of 45-75 ft. Moderately tolerant of extreme winds due to shallow roots.	Pine, Red: Grows up to 35' tall. Rapid growing tree with long, glossy-green needles. Prefers dry or sandy soil. Deer typically do not browse this species.
Fir, Caanan: This tree is a genetic cross between Fraser Fir and Balsam Fir. Growing 30'-70' tall, this tree makes an excellent Christmas tree.	Pine, White: Growing up to 80' tall, with long, soft, bluish-green needles. Will need protection from deer browse until it's well established.
Fir, Fraiser: Growing up to 30'-50' tall, this tree is often referred to as the Cadillac of the Christmas trees. Has excellent fragrance.	Spruce, Colorado Blue: Grows over 60' tall. Densely formed tree with stiff, silvery-blue to bluish-green needles.
Deciduous Trees: All native to our area of the state (exception to paper birch) all these deciduous trees provide important cover and food for pollinators and numerous wildlife.	
Birch, Paper (White): Typically found in northern WI, this tree grows up to 50' tall. The bark is brown to bronze, but turns white as the tree ages. Often planted as an ornamental tree in yards in our area.	Oak, Swamp White: Grows up to 50-60' tall. Does well in moist to wet soils, but also does well in upland areas.
Maple, Sugar: Slow to medium growth. Grows up to 100' tall. Dark green leaves turn yellow to orange to fiery red in the fall.	Oak, White: Can grow upward of 100' tall. Slow growing and extremely long lived (300 years or longer). Produces acorns enjoyed by game species.
Oak, Red: Attaining a height of 80'-90' tall, this species is known as a great shade tree. Produces acorns enjoyed by game species. Will need protection from deer browse.	
Deciduous Shrubs: All native to our area, providing food and cover for game, song birds and pollinators!	
Cranberry, Highbush: Going up to 8' tall, with attractive foliage that turns red and orange in the fall. Clusters of white flowers that later produce red berries that are loved by birds.	Hazelnut, American: Going up to 12' tall, starts as small clump that can spread or be trained into a hedgerow if managed. Produces nuts eaten by turkey and deer. Grows best in moist, well drained soils.
Dogwood, Redosier: Grows 7'-9' tall. Typically spreads creating thickets. A broad erect grower with branches turning red in the winter. Stems have been used in some flower arrangements	Plum, American: Grows 15'-20' tall. A small tree or large shrub depending on how you manage it. White flowers developing into small red plums with orange flesh.
Elderberry: Grows 5'-12' tall. Fast growing large shrub that also spreads. Does fairly well in wetter areas. Produces dark purple berries that are attractive to birds. <u>Not recommended to plant near buildings.</u>	Serviceberry (Juneberry): A bird lover's delight! Growing up to 15' tall, this shrub has white flowers turning to small blue colored berries with leaves turning orange-red in the fall. Can spread by suckers.
Tree Gel (2 oz. packs)	
Containing a polymer gel which absorbs and holds water to keep plant roots from drying out. Also contains humic acids, biostimulants, beneficial bacteria, soluble sea kelp, and yucca plant extracts to promote rapid root development. This amount treats approximately 125 seedlings.
