LAFAYETTE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING APRIL 18, 2017 • 7:30 P.M. LAFAYETTE COUNTY COURTHOUSE COUNTY BOARD ROOM

The Lafayette County Board of Supervisors' meeting was brought to order at 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday, April 18, 2017 by County Board Chairman Jack Sauer. A prayer was led by Mr. Wayne Wilson. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mr. Wilson. Roll call was taken by Lafayette County Clerk, Carla M. Jacobson, beginning with Mr. Jack Wiegel. There were Fifteen (15) members present with One (1) member absent. Chairman Sauer declared a quorum. Present were: Larry Ludlum – District 1; Steve Spensley – District 2; Jack Sauer - District 3; Leon Wolfe - District 4; Dwayne Larson - District 5; Tony Ruesga – District 6; Bob Boyle – District 7; Kriss Marion - District 8; Wayne L. Wilson - District 9; Jack Wiegel – District 10; John Bartels - District 11; Gerald Heimann - District 12; Ted Wiegel - District 13; Carol Korn - District 14; and John Perkins – District 16. David W. Hammer - District 15, had an excused absence.

Chairman Sauer asked the Clerk, Carla M. Jacobson, if the meeting had been properly posted. Ms. Jacobson said the meeting notice was posted in the Courthouse, at the Darlington Municipal Building, at Memorial Hospital of Lafayette County, on the Lafayette County Website, and was sent to the press.

Chairman Sauer asked the board for approval of the agenda. Motion by Wilson, second by Ruesga, to approve the agenda as presented. Voice vote. Motion carried.

Chairman Sauer asked the board's wishes regarding the minutes from the March 21, 2017 Lafayette County Board of Supervisors' Meeting. Motion by Larson, second by Wolfe, for approval of the minutes as presented. Voice vote. Motion carried.

Chairman Sauer said the Wind Mill Companies, located in Seymour Township, will be starting shortly.

Appointments:

Reports:

Chairman Sauer asked the board their wishes for the approval of the 2016 Lafayette County Five Year Long Range Plan for Library Services, as presented by Library Committee member Bob Boyle and Director of the Johnson Public Library, Candi Fitzsimons. Their mission statement is to provide quality library services to all residents of Lafayette County as they continuously educate themselves, and to provide for equitable funding for those services. County residents are free to use any public library within Lafayette County, as well as the Southwest Wisconsin Library System member public libraries, with their full range of services; and, through agreements, public libraries located in counties outside SWLS. Whereas, the County Board of Lafayette County, Wisconsin has adopted Resolution 40-07 the "Lafayette County Comprehensive Plan" pursuant to ss.66.101 (4)(c) of the Wisconsin Statutes;

Whereas, Lafayette County adopted a Farmland Preservation Plan in 2016 that was certified by the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) as making qualified land eligible for farmland preservation tax credits:

Whereas, The Farmland Preservation Program empowering statute, Chapter 91 Wl. Stats., was revised by the 2009-2011 Wisconsin Administrative Rules promulgated in 2010 directing the comprehensive

revision of all existing county farmland preservation plans;

Whereas, Chapter 91.10(2) WI. Stats. Now requires consistency between the Farmland Preservation Plan and the county's Comprehensive Plan, which DATCP has deemed accomplished by incorporating the Farmland Preservation Plan and Farmland Preservation Ordinance into the Comprehensive Plan:

Whereas, the Lafayette County Conservation and Zoning Department and the Lafayette County Planning and Zoning Committee contracted Southwestern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission to prepare and submit to DATCP an update to the existing Lafayette county comprehensive Plan and the Farmland Preservation Plan;

Whereas, the final draft of the revised Farmland Preservation Plan and Farmland Preservation Ordinance have been reviewed and certified by DATCP with the condition that it be approved by the Lafayette County Board and incorporated into the Lafayette County Comprehensive Plan;

Whereas, the final draft of the revised Farmland Preservation Plan and Farmland Preservation Ordinance have been reviewed and certified by DATCP with the condition that it also be approved by the Lafayette County Board and incorporated into the Lafayette County Comprehensive Plan to include the maps of the Blanchard Township;

Whereas, a public hearing was held before the Lafayette County Planning & Zoning Committee on March 23, 2017 as required by ss. 66.1001(4) Wisconsin Statute after which action was taken by the Committee to recommend approving the revised Farmland Preservation Plan for incorporation into the Lafayette County Comprehensive Plan as Appendix A1.

Ms. Christopher does not believe it was researched enough and would like to revisit this ordinance. Corporation Counsel Nathan Russell told the board

that any City or Village in Lafayette County could opt out of this Ordinance. Townships cannot opt out. Chairman Sauer suggested that perhaps we revisit this Ordinance with a list of some of the concerns and to include Ag & Extension.

Appointments: Chairman Sauer asked the board their wishes for the appointment of Peggy Steger and Peggy Soehnlein, to the ADRC COA Advisory Board for a three year term. Motion by Korn, second by Ludlum for approval of the appointments. Voice vote. Motion carried.

The DRAFT 2016 Financial Results of the County (excluding the Hospital) were presented to the board by Carla A. Gogin, CPA, Partner of Baker Tilly Virchow Krause, LLP. This year the county decided to split the audit with the hospital being audited by Holly Pokrandt, Partner of Wipfli LLP. Ms. Gogin handed out a report to the County Board dated August 15, 2017. Ms. Gogin went through bench marks of the report. Ms. Gogin said that the financial results should be finalized by the end of the month. The total fund balance in the General Fund was \$5,151,560. Total expenditures was \$17,645,023. Total Assigned and Unassigned Fund Balance was \$3,515,790 leaving an Assigned and Unassigned General Fund -Fund Balance as % of above expenditures of 19.33% which is consistent with previous years. Net Revenues (Expenditures) is \$181,228. Under General Long-Term Debt, the total outstanding general obligation (G.O.) debt less the amount available in the Debt Service Fund was \$3,422,619 leaving a total G.O. debt capacity of \$56,164,410 with a 6.09% of debt limit. The percentage of debt serve to Non-capital Expenditures is 2.14%. Total operating loss for the Manor was (\$989,972). Income (Loss) before contributions and transfers was (\$199,332). After a transfer in of \$48,929 from the general fund for tax levy support the change in net position was (\$150,403). For the Highway Department, there was an increase in the net position of \$503,260. Holly Pokrandt, of Wipfli LLP, Presented the financial results for Memorial Hospital of Lafayette County. The Hospital had a decrease in unrestricted net assets as of December 31, 2016 of (\$298,000). Under Statements of Net Position, total assets and deferred outflows of resources was \$11,168,924. Under Statements of Revenues, Expenses, and Change in Net Position, the net position at the end of the year was \$7,312,237.00. Under Cash Flows, cash and cash equivalents at the end of year was \$2,218,906. A copy of both reports are available, upon request, at the Lafayette County Clerk's Office.

Highway Commissioner Tom Jean updated the board on the progress of the Multi-Purpose Building and cost approval. Tom said they broke ground on the site preparation yesterday. This will be a facility for the whole county to use. Bids were received. Local contractors came in with the low bids. The building size is 200 by 80 for the cold storage building, and a 48 by 80 room facility on the end of that which will double as an emergency command center for the Sheriff's Department. Housing will be available for the COA busses in the cold storage building. Successful bidders were: Nodolf Lumber for materials - \$284,980.00; Ubersox Construction for construction - \$107,900.00; Gentz Electric for electrical - \$70,924.00; Fritz's Burner for HVAC - \$49,900.00; Mike Crist Plumbing for plumbing - \$49,500.00; By County Highway Forces for concrete, excavation and finish work - \$130,000.00. Totaling - \$693,204.00

 - (2) Speed Limit for Operation of ATV/UTV on all Trails or Routes.
- a. Speed Limit 30MPH, unless posted at slower speed. No person shall operate an ATV / UTV in excess of 30 mph on any trail or route within Lafayette County.
- (3) Penalty. Any person who violates any provision of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be subject to a forfeiture not to exceed \$200.00.

LAFAYETTE COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 8-1-1.20 OPERATE AN ATV / UTV WITH OPEN INTOXICANTS

- (1) Definitions. The definitions as stated in Wisconsin Statutes § 23.33 are adopted and incorporated by reference for purposes of this ordinance.
- (2) Possession of Open Intoxicants in an ATV or UTV while in operation. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess an open intoxicant container while operating, or as a passenger on an ATV or UTV on any road or road route in Lafavette County.
- (3) Penalty. Any Person who violates any provision of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be subject to a forfeiture not to exceed \$200.00.

LAFAYETTE COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 8-1-1.21 SEATBELT USE IN UTV MANDATORY

- (1) Definitions. The definitions as stated in Wisconsin Statutes § 23.33 are adopted and incorporated by reference for purposes of this ordinance.

THE BUDGET PROCESS

At the direction of the Finance Committee, the 2018 budget process remained similar to the process from prior years. Budget requests were reviewed and approved by the departmental committees and then submitted to the Finance Department. The Finance Director summarized and presented the budgets to the Finance Committee with new request for levy identified separately from the basic 2018 budgets. The Finance Committee convened nine meetings to consider the budget requests culminating in a 2018 Budget which met the levy allowed by state statute, as explained below. This budget would not have been possible without the cooperation and contribution from the Finance Managers and department heads throughout the county, as well as the support staff within the Finance Department. Your hard work does not go unnoticed!

PROPERTY TAX LIMITATION & 2018 LEVY

Per WI State Statute 66.0602, Wisconsin counties are subject to a tax levy limit. This limit restricts a county's levy increase to the greater of 0% or the county's net new construction growth in equalized value otherwise known as "new growth." The County's net new construction growth for the 2018 budget was only .34%, which is considerably lower than in prior years. A correction in the manufacturing assessed value within the City of Darlington of -\$6.9 Million (-5.96%), caused a large impact on the net new construction percentage as a whole for Lafayette County. This equates to a \$23,475 allowable operating levy increase. Due to the minimal levy increase, it was approved to use \$224,000 from the county's current sales tax carryover. The proposed budget sets the operating levy at the legal maximum for Lafayette County in 2018 which is \$6,927,900. After adjustments, including debt service, library aid, and county bridge aid, the total proposed 2018 levy is \$8,012,329.

EQUALIZED VALUATION & MILL RATE

Lafayette County's equalized valuation increased 3.021% to \$1,114,710,800, not including tax incremental districts. Combined with a levy of \$8,012,329, this produces a mill rate of \$7.02 per \$1,000, which is an increase of 1.30% over the 2017 Mill Rate.

DEBT SERVICE LEVY

The debt service levy reflects the County Board's decision to fund certain capital projects through the extension of promissory notes. The 2018 budget includes \$1,229,000 of anticipated new debt to fund purchases by the Highway Department, IT, and Property/Maintenance. The debt repayments of this borrowing will be funded entirety by debt service tax levy.

The 2018 debt service levy is \$899,466, resulting in a debt service tax levy increase of \$26.47 per \$100,000.

COST OF LIVING ADJUSTMENT & HEALTH INSURANCE

At the direction of the Finance Committee, the 2018 Budget includes a county-wide pay increase of \$0.25/hour. Also, as expected, the health insurance premiums for 2018 have increased, but it was decided to remain at the maximum employer contribution percentage of 88% to keep costs as low as possible for our employees.

2018 BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

The following summary will identify and provide an explanation of tax levy changes greater than \$50,000 to departmental budgets from the previous fiscal year.

Sheriff – Increase for 2018-20 union contract (assumed at 2%), Drug Officer no longer grant funded, increased Courthouse security - \$150,765

Debt Service – Increase for one short term note to be paid fully in 2020 for Highway Dept. capital equipment purchases and Maintenance/Property projects, as well as one larger, longer term note to fund the construction of the Highway Dept. multi-use building and improvement of the county-wide IT infrastructure. - \$492,918

PERSONAL DAYS (ANNUAL)

- 1. All regular full-time employees receive three (3) annual personal days on January 1 of each year. Because land information once available in the office is now also available online, the Lafayette County Land Information Department will begin limiting assistance to private professionals. Professionals will find mapping information online here_and tax/assessment information online here. All professionals may continue to research the paper files for survey records while Land Information staff continues to back-index these documents; however, staff will provide digital copies of these documents at no charge via flash drive to anyone who provides the office with a new and unopened flash drive. Per State Statute, all recorded documents will continue to be available in the Register of Deeds Office.

Any professional that believes they have found a discrepancy in the land records should submit a written or email request to the Land Information Department (email: landrecords@lafayettecountywi.org) with appropriate documentation. Professionals shall include tax parcel numbers, acreages, copies of documents, owner information, or any other relevant data. If a title search is not done, and documentation is not presented, then the request will not be reviewed. If a request is submitted, the Land Information Department reserves the right to look at the request and documentation in a manner that fits into day-to-day operations, which take first priority. This means staff may not respond to requests immediately. RESOLUTION NO. 83 – 17 ENGAGE LEGAL COUNSEL FOR LITIGATION PURPOSES TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY MEMBERS,

WHEREAS, Lafayette County ("County") is concerned with the recent rapid rise in troubles among County citizens, residents, and visitors in relation to problems arising out of the use, abuse and overuse of opioid medications, which according to certain studies, impacts millions of people across the country; and

WHEREAS, issues and concerns surrounding opioid use, abuse and overuse by citizens, residents and visitors are not unique to County and are, in fact, issues and concerns shared by all other counties in Wisconsin and, for that matter, states and counties across the country, as has been well documented through various reports and publications, and is commonly referred to as the Opioid Epidemic ("Opioid Epidemic:); and

WHEREAS, the societal costs associated with the Opioid Epidemic are staggering and, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, amount to over \$75 billion annually; and

WHEREAS, the National Institute for Health has identified the manufacturers of certain of the opioid medications as being directly responsible for the rapid rise of the Opioid Epidemic by virtue of their aggressive and, according to some, unlawful and unethical marketing practices; and

WHEREAS, certain of the opioid manufacturers have faced civil and criminal liability for their actions that relate directly to the rise of the Opioid Epidemic; and

WHEREAS, County has spent significant amounts of money in unexpected and unbudgeted time and resources in its programs and services related to the Opioid Epidemic; and

WHEREAS, County is responsible for a multitude of programs and services, all of which require County to expend resources generated through state and federal aid, property tax levy, fees and other permissible revenue sources; and

WHEREAS, County's provision of programs and services becomes more and more difficult every year because the costs associated with providing the Opioid Epidemic programs and services continue to rise, yet County's ability to generate revenue is limited by strict levy limit caps and stagnant or declining state and federal aid to County; and

WHEREAS, all sums that County expends in addressing, combatting and otherwise dealing with the Opioid Epidemic are sums that cannot be used for other critical programs and services that County provides to County citizens, residents and visitors; and

WHEREAS, County has been informed that numerous counties and states across the country have filed or intend to file lawsuits against certain of the opioid manufacturers in an effort to force the persons and entities responsible for the Opioid Epidemic to assume financial responsibility for the costs associated with addressing, combatting and otherwise dealing with the Opioid Epidemic; and

WHEREAS, County has engaged in discussions with representatives of the law firms of Crueger Dickinson LLC, Simmons Hanly Conroy LLC, and von Briesen & Roper, s.c., (the "Law Firms") related to the potential for County to pursue certain legal claims against certain opioid manufacturers; and

WHEREAS, County has been informed that the Law Firms have the requisite skill, experience and wherewithal to prosecute legal claims against certain of the opioid manufacturers on behalf of public entities seeking to hold them responsible for the Opioid Epidemic; and

WHEREAS, the Law Firms have proposed that County engage the Law Firms to prosecute the aforementioned claims on a contingent fee basis whereby the Law Firms would not be compensated unless County receives a financial benefit as a result of the proposed claims and the Law Firms would advance all claim-related costs and expenses associated with the claims; and

WHEREAS, all of the costs and expenses associated with the claims against certain of the opioid manufacturers would be borne by the Law Firms: and

WHEREAS, the Law Firms have prepared an engagement letter, which is submitted as part of this Resolution ("Engagement Letter") specifying the terms and conditions under which the Law Firms would provide legal services to County and otherwise consistent with the terms of this Resolution; and

WHEREAS, County is informed that the Wisconsin Counties Association has engaged in extensive discussions with the Law Firms and has expressed a desire to assist the Law Firms, County and other counties in the prosecution of claims against certain of the opioid manufacturers; and

WHEREAS, County would participate in the prosecution of the claim(s) contemplated in this Resolution and the Engagement Letter by providing information and materials to the Law Firms and, as appropriate, the Wisconsin Counties Association as needed; and

WHEREAS, County believes it to be in the best interest of County, its citizens, residents, visitors and taxpayers to join with other counties in and outside Wisconsin in pursuit of claims against certain of the opioid manufacturers, all upon the terms and conditions set forth in the Engagement Letter; and

WHEREAS, by pursuing the claims against certain of the opioid manufacturers, County is attempting to hold those persons and entities that had a significant role in the creation of the Opioid Epidemic responsible for the financial costs assumed by County and other public agencies across the country in dealing with the Opioid Epidemic.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

County authorizes, and agrees to be bound by, the Engagement Letter and hereby directs the appropriate officer of the County to execute the Engagement Letter on behalf of the County; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

County shall endeavor to faithfully perform all actions required of County in relation to the claims contemplated herein and in the Engagement Letter and hereby directs all County personnel to cooperate with and assist the Law Firms in relation thereto.

Presentation by Matt Wallmow and Steve Juckem of U.S., Cellular Titled "Crexendo:" A recent partnership has been rolled out with Crexendo which is a unified communication system.
