Lafayette County Board of Supervisors Minutes Tuesday, April 19, 2022 • 7:30 p.m. Lafayette County Courthouse County Board Room

Chairman Sauer called the Lafayette County Board of Supervisors' Meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday, April 19, 2022. County Board Supervisor, Mr. Bob Boyle, led the prayer. Chairman Sauer asked Veteran Mr. Gary Benson, to lead the Pledge of Allegiance. There were Fifteen (15) members present with one seat vacant, due to the resignation of Robert Laeser of District 9. Chairman Sauer declared a quorum. Present were: Larry Ludlum - District 1; Kurt Malott - District 2; Jack Sauer - District 3; John E. Reichling - District 4; Luke McGuire - District 5; Jeff Berget - District 6; Bob Boyle - District 7; Kriss Marion - District 8; Gary Benson - District 10; Donna Flannery - District 11; Carmen McDonald, District 12; Lee A. Gill - District 13; Daniel Morrissey - District 14; Scott Pedley - District 15; and Rita Buchholz - District 16.

Chairman Sauer asked the Lafayette County Clerk, Carla Jacobson, if the meeting notice was properly posted. Ms. Jacobson said the meeting notice was posted at all of the County Buildings (Lafayette County Courthouse, Memorial Hospital, Lafayette Manor, Highway Department, Land Conservation, Human Services, Health Department) the City of Darlington Municipal Building, the Lafayette County Website and sent to the press.

Chairman Sauer asked the board's wishes for approval of the agenda. Motion by Mr. Pedley, second by Ms. Marion, for approval of the agenda as presented. Voice vote. Motion carried.

Chairman Sauer asked the board's wishes for approval of the minutes from the March 15, 2022, Lafayette County Board of Supervisors' meeting. Motion by Mr. Ludlum, second by Ms. Buchholz, to approve the minutes as presented. Voice vote. Motion carried.

Comments and Correspondence:

Chairman Sauer welcomed the three new County Board Supervisors – Jeff Berget, District 6; Gary Benson, District 10; and Dan Morrissey, District 14

Chairman Sauer said he received correspondence from Department Manager of the Land Conservation and Planning and Zoning Department Erica Sauer, addressed to the Lafayette County Board of Supervisors, regarding a release of the Swigg Study Results. The results from the Southwest Wisconsin Groundwater and Geology Study (SWIGG Study) of Grant, Iowa, and Lafayette Counties will be released on May 16, 2022 at 6:00 p.m., at the Grant County Fairgrounds Youth and Ag Building in Lancaster, Wisconsin. A zoom option will be available.

Reports and Appointments: None.

Chief Operating Officer Molly Wiegel and Nurse Cassie Prine, of Memorial Hospital of Lafayette County, thanked the board for their effort and support in the acquisition of the New Hospital Replacement Facility. The board was presented with a thank you signed by all of the employees of the hospital.

County Clerk Carla Jacobson said that the 2022 Wisconsin Counties Association Annual Conference is going to be held September 18-20, 2022 in Sauk County at the Kalahari Resort & Convention Center. Any County Board members interested in attending the conference should contact the County Clerk's Office.

Ms. Marion informed the board of a County Board Orientation Workshop Tour for new and current County Board members, to be held on May 5th from 8:45 a.m., to 1:00 p.m., starting at 8:45 a.m. at the Multi-Purpose Building, and ending at the Fairgrounds at 1:00 p.m. Included in the first tour on May 5th, is the Highway, EMS, Jail, Courthouse, Fairgrounds, Extension, Land Conservation and Planning and Zoning. A second tour will be scheduled sometime in June yet to be determined. The second tour will include the Manor, Hospital, Health Department, Human Services and Housing.

Chairman Sauer continued on with the election of County Board officers beginning with the election of County Board Chair. Motion by Mr. Ludlum, second by Ms. Gill, to nominate Jack Sauer, as County Board Chair. Chairman Sauer asked for any other nominations from the floor. Chairman Sauer, three times, asked for any other nominations. Hearing none, motion by Ms. McDonald, second by Mr. Reichling, to close nominations and cast a unanimous ballot for Mr. Sauer as County Board Chair. Voice vote. Motion carried. Mr. Sauer was by unanimous vote declared as the County Board Chair for the April, 2022 through April, 2024 term. Mr. Sauer thanked the board.

Chairman Sauer continued on with the election of First Vice-Chair. The

First Vice-Chair is also the Chair of the Finance Committee and an automatic member of the Executive, Rules & Legislative Committee. Motion by Ms. Gill, second by Mr. Malott, to nominate Scott Pedley as First Vice-Chair. Chairman Sauer, three times, asked for any other nominations. Hearing none, motion by Ms. Flannery, second by Ms. McDonald, to close nominations and cast a unanimous ballot for Mr. Pedley as First Vice-Chair. Voice vote. Motion carried. Mr. Pedley was by unanimous vote declared as the First Vice-Chair for the April, 2022 through April, 2024 term. Mr. Pedley thanked the board.

Chairman Sauer continued on with the election of Second Vice-Chair. The Second Vice-Chair is the automatic Chair of the Executive, Rules & Legislative Committee. Motion by Mr. Pedley, second by Ms. Marion, to nominate Carmen McDonald, as Second Vice-Chair. Chairman Sauer, three times, asked for any other nominations. Hearing none, motion by Mr. Pedley, second by Mr. Ludlum, to close nominations and cast a unanimous ballot for Ms. McDonald, as Second Vice-Chair. Voice vote. Motion carried. Ms. McDonald, was by unanimous vote declared as the Second Vice-Chair for the April, 2022 through April, 2024 term. Ms. McDonald thanked the

Chairman Sauer continued on with the election of the Highway Committee. The names of the candidates who want to be considered for the Highway Committee are Bob Boyle, John Reichling, Lee Gill, Jeff Berget, Daniel Morrissey, Carmen McDonald and Luke McGuire. Chairman Sauer reminded the board that every County Board member was to either indicate their district number on the ballot and/or to sign their name on the ballot. Also, each ballot calls for the voting of "not more than four" Highway Committee members. County Clerk Carla Jacobson and Chief Deputy Clerk Ms. Laurie Monson, collected and counted the ballots. Ms. Jacobson, said the result was John Reichling 12 Votes, Lee Gill 11 votes, Carmen McDonald 11 votes, Bob Boyle 9 votes, Luke McGuire 7 votes, Carmen McDonald 11 votes and Jeff Berget 4 votes. Mr. Sauer congratulated the four top vote getters John Reichling, Lee Gill, Carmen McDonald and Bob Boyle, as the members of the Highway Committee for the April, 2022 through April, 2024 term.

Chairman Sauer appointed the members of the Executive, Rules and Legislation Committee for the April, 2022 through April, 2024 term: Ms. McDonald, as Chair of the committee (automatic Chair due to being elected Second Vice-Chair), Mr. Pedley (automatic member due to being elected First Vice-Chair), Larry Ludlum, John Reichling and Lee Gill. Chairman Sauer said a meeting of the Executive, Rules and Legislation Committee, will be held Thursday, April 21, 2022 at 6:30 p.m., to appoint the committees.

Chairman Sauer called upon Mr. Pedley, Chair of the Human Services Committee, to present Resolution 1-22 Elimination of the Badger Care Eligibility Cliff. This would eliminate the Badger Care benefit cliff with a proportionate sliding fee scale, that as individuals and families earn additional dollars, there is a corresponding but smaller contribution amount toward their health insurance coverage. After the reading of the resolution, motion by Mr. Pedley, second by Ms. Buchholz, for approval of the resolution as presented. On a voice vote, the motion carried.

Resolution 01 - 22

Elimination of the Badger Care Eligibility Cliff

WHEREAS, in addition to Medicaid, the State of Wisconsin also administers Badger Care Plus (Badger Care), a similar program for groups of people who need healthcare coverage but may not qualify for Medicaid or need different kinds of services; and

WHEREAS, those individuals who go beyond qualifying for Badger Care face a benefits cliff, which can occur when a public support program is designed in such a way that at a certain level of income, a small increase in earnings can result in significant ineligibility for benefits; and

WHEREAS, this benefit cliff, in some instances, becomes a barrier for individuals seeking employment, or seeking better employment; and

WHEREAS, allowing individuals to work productively without harming their health benefits, not only reduces the cost of a benefit program, but also simultaneously improves the overall economic activity of a region.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Lafayette County Board of Supervisors, do hereby request the Wisconsin State Legislature and Governor Tony Evers work cooperatively to eliminate the Badger Care benefit cliff; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Badger Care benefit cliff be eliminated with a proportionate sliding fee scale, that as individuals and families earn additional dollars, there is a corresponding but smaller contribution amount toward their health insurance coverage; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be forwarded to Governor Evers, federal and state legislative representatives for Lafayette County, the Wisconsin Counties Association and other Wisconsin Counties.

RESOLUTION 6 - 22

APPROVING PARTICIPATION IN WISMAC/WISCONSIN MUTUAL AID COMPACT FOR EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

WHEREAS, emergencies involving natural disasters and/or technological incidents will arise, which may require additional assistance beyond the resources of Lafayette County Emergency Management; and

WHEREAS, the training and/or expertise of other emergency management personnel throughout the State of Wisconsin could be requested to assist with natural and/or technological incidents within Lafayette County; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin Emergency Management (WEM) coordinates a Wisconsin Statewide Mutual Aid Compact for Local Emergency Management Assistance (WiSMAC) providing all counties, cities, municipalities, towns and villages participation in a large mutual aid agreement; and

WHEREAS, natural disasters and/or technological incidents can more effectively be handled by pooling human resources of other emergency management providers within the State of Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Statewide Mutual Aid Compact for Local Emergency Management Assistance, WiSMAC (see attached WiSMAC compact) provides the organization and structure to bring participating emergency management providers, throughout the state together, to respond to natural and/or technological incidents.

Wisconsin Statewide Mutual Aid Compact for Local Emergency Management Assistance

This Wisconsin Statewide Mutual Aid Compact is made and entered into this 21st day of June, 2022 by and between participating Counties, Cities, Villages, and Towns as well as federally-recognized Indian tribes and bands (Member), within the State of Wisconsin as authorized by their respective governing bodies.

WHEREAS, emergencies involving natural disasters and/or technological incidents will arise throughout the State of Wisconsin, which may require additional assistance beyond each Member's own resources; and

WHEREAS, the training and/or expertise of local emergency management personnel throughout the State of Wisconsin could be requested to assist in dealing with natural disasters and/or technological incidents within the state: and

WHEREAS, the Members recognize that natural disasters and/or technological incidents can more effectively be handled by pooling of human resources; and

WHEREAS, the Members have authority to enter into this Wisconsin Statewide Mutual Aid Compact pursuant to Sections 59.03, 59.04, 66.0301, 66.0313, 66.0314, and 323.14 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, the Members agree as follows:

- 1. Purpose: The Members agree to use their best efforts to ensure the public safety and protect the citizens within the confines of the geographical jurisdictions of the respective Members.
- 2. Term: The duration of this Compact shall be a one-year period; the Compact shall automatically be renewed on a year-to-year basis. Any of the Members may terminate this Compact by providing at least ninety (90) days written notice of said intent to terminate participation in the Compact to all other Members to the Compact.
- 3. No Joint Venture: No separate legal entity will be created by this Compact.
- 4. Approval Authority: The power to make a request for assistance or to provide assistance under this Compact shall reside in the Emergency Management Department of each respective Member County, City, Village, Town, Tribe or Band. Requests for assistance will be made by following the WISMAC Procedure
- 5. Right of Refusal: It is expressly understood and agreed by the Members hereto that the rendering of assistance under the terms of this Compact shall not be mandatory and shall be within the sole discretion of the Member receiving the request. Assistance may be refused, and assistance which is being provided may be terminated at any time, within the sole discretion of the Member receiving the request. In situations where the Member's emergency management personnel are unable to furnish the requested assistance, they will notify the requesting Member as soon as practicable that assistance will not be rendered. No Member may make any claim whatsoever against the requested Member for refusal of assistance.
- 6. Employment Status: All emergency management personnel acting on behalf of a Member under this Compact shall, at all times, remain the employee of that Member.
- 7. Compensation: A responding Member may invoice an impacted Member for miles, meals, and lodging expenses for emergency management personnel provided. Actual personnel time shall not be reimbursed but will be documented as volunteer hours, as specified in the WiSMAC Procedure
 - 8. Duration: A responding Member's deployment is limited to 72 hours

with the option to extend if mutually agreeable to the responding the requesting Member.

- 9. Statutory Protections: It is agreed by the Members that nothing in this Compact, including but not limited to indemnification and hold harmless clauses, shall in any way constitute a waiver on the part of the Members of any immunity, liability limitation or other protection available to them under any applicable statute or other law. To the extent that any provision of this Compact is found by any court or competent jurisdiction to conflict with any such legal protection, then whichever protections, either statutory or contractual, provide a greater benefit to the Member shall apply unless the Member elects otherwise
- 10. Incident Command Structure: In the event of an incident, emergency management personnel will operate under the established incident command structure of the requesting Member.
- 11. Public Liability and Property Damage Insurance: A Member shall maintain, at its own expense, and keep in effect during the term of this Compact, commercial liability, bodily injury and property damage insurance against any claim(s) which might occur in carrying out this Compact. Minimum coverage is one million (\$1,000,000) liability for bodily injury and property damage including products liability and completed operations. If a Member is self-insured or uninsured, a Certificate of Protection in Lieu of an Insurance Policy shall, if requested, be submitted to the responding Member certifying that the requesting Member is protected by a Self-Funded Liability and Property Program or alternative funding source(s). The Certificate is required to be presented to the responding Member, when requested, prior to receipt of emergency management personnel services under this Compact.
- 12. Automobile Liability: A Member shall obtain and keep in effect automobile liability insurance for all owned, non-owned and hired vehicles that are used in carrying out this Compact. This coverage may be written in combination with the commercial liability and property damage insurance mentioned in Section 8. Minimum coverage shall be one million (\$1,000.000) per occurrence combined single limit for automobile liability and property damage. If a Member is self-insured or uninsured, a Certificate of Protection in Lieu of an Insurance Policy shall, if requested, be submitted to the responding Member certifying that the requesting Member is protected by a Self-Funded Liability and Property Program or alternative funding source(s). The Certificate is required to be presented to the responding Member, when requested, prior to receipt of emergency management personnel services under this Compact
- 13. Severability: If any provision of this Compact is declared by a court to be illegal or in conflict with any law, the validity of the remaining terms and provisions shall not be affected. The rights and obligations of the Members shall be construed and enforced as if the Compact did not contain the particular provision held to be invalid.
- 14. Construction of Compact: This Compact is intended to be solely between the Members hereto. No part of the Compact shall be construed to add, supplement, amend, abridge, or repeal existing rights, benefits or privileges of any third party or parties, including but not limited to employees of the Members.
- 15. Assignment: No right or duty, in whole or in part, of the Member under this Compact may be assigned or delegated without the prior written consent of the other Members.
- 16. Waiver: A waiver by any Member of any breach of this Compact shall be in writing. Such a waiver shall not affect the waiving Member's rights with respect to any other or further breach.
- 17. Applicable Law: This Compact shall be governed under the laws of the State of Wisconsin. The Members shall at all times comply with and observe all federal and state laws, local laws, ordinances and regulations which are in effect during the period of this Compact and which may in any manner affect the work or its conduct.
- 18. Multiple Originals: This contract may be executed in multiple originals, each of which together shall constitute a single Compact.

WHEREAS, the County Board of Supervisors previously authorized the County to enter into an engagement agreement with von Briesen & Roper, s.c., Crueger Dickinson LLC and Simmons Hanly Conroy LLC (the "Law Firms") to pursue litigation against certain manufacturers, distributors, and retailers of opioid pharmaceuticals (the "Opioid Defendants") in an effort to hold the Opioid Defendants financially responsible for the County's expenditure of vast money and resources to combat the opioid epidemic;

WHEREAS, on behalf of the County, the Law Firms filed a lawsuit against the Opioid Defendants;

WHEREAS, the Law Firms filed similar lawsuits on behalf of 66 other Wisconsin counties and all Wisconsin cases were coordinated with thousands of other lawsuits filed against the same or substantially similar parties as the Opioid Defendants in the Northern District of Ohio, captioned *In re: Opioid Litigation*, MDL 2804 (the "Litigation");

WHEREAS, four (4) additional Wisconsin counties (Milwaukee, Dane, Waukesha, and Walworth) hired separate counsel and joined the Litigation;

WHEREAS, since the inception of the Litigation, the Law Firms have coordinated with counsel from around the country (including counsel for Milwaukee, Dane, Waukesha, and Walworth Counties) to prepare the County's case for trial and engage in extensive settlement discussions with the Opioid Defendants;

WHEREAS, the settlement discussions with Teva Pharmaceutical Industries Ltd., Allergan Finance, LLC, Walgreen Co., Walmart, Inc., CVS Health Corporation and CVS Pharmacy, Inc. (the "Settling Defendants") resulted in a tentative agreement as to settlement terms pending agreement from the County and other plaintiffs involved in the Litigation:

WHEREAS, the Settlement Agreements provide, among other things, for the payment of certain sums to Participating Subdivisions (as defined in the Settlement Agreements) upon the occurrence of certain events detailed in the Settlement Agreements;

WHEREAS, the County is a Participating Subdivision in the Settlement Agreements and has the opportunity to participate in the benefits associated with the Settlement Agreement provided the County (a) approves the Settlement Agreements; (b) approves the Memorandum of Understanding allocating proceeds from the Settlement Agreements among the various Wisconsin Participating Subdivisions, a copy of which is attached to this Resolution (the "Allocation MOU"); (c) approves the Memorandum of Understanding with the Wisconsin Attorney General regarding allocation of settlement proceeds, a copy of which is attached to this Resolution (the "AG MOU"); and (d) the Legislature's Joint Committee on Finance approves the terms of the Settlement Agreements and the AG MOU;

WHEREAS, 2021 Wisconsin Act 57 created Section 165.12 of the Wisconsin Statutes relating to the settlement of all or part of the Litigation;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 165.12(2), the Legislature's Joint Committee on Finance is required to approve the Settlement Agreements and the AG MOU;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 165.12(2), the proceeds from any settlement of all or part of the Litigation are distributed 70% to local governments in Wisconsin that are parties to the Litigation and 30% to the State;

WHEREAS, Wis. Stat. § 165.12(4)(b)2. provides the proceeds from the Settlement Agreement must be deposited in a segregated account (the "Opioid Abatement Account") and may be expended only for approved uses for opioid abatement as provided in the Settlement Agreements;

WHEREAS, Wis. Stat. § 165.12(7) bars claims from any Wisconsin local government against the Opioid Defendants filed after June 1, 2021;

WHEREAS, the definition of Participating Subdivisions in the Settlement Agreements recognizes a statutory bar on claims such as that set forth in Wis. Stat. § 165.12(7) and, as a result, the only Participating Subdivisions in Wisconsin are those counties and municipalities that were parties to the Litigation (or otherwise actively litigating a claim against one, some, or all of the Opioid Defendants) as of June 1, 2021;

WHEREAS, the Legislature's Joint Committee on Finance is not statutorily authorized or required to approve the allocation of proceeds of the Settlement Agreements among Wisconsin Participating Subdivisions;

WHEREAS, the Law Firms have engaged in extensive discussions with counsel for all other Wisconsin Participating Subdivisions resulting in the proposed Allocation MOU, which is an agreement between all of the entities identified in the Allocation MOU as to how the proceeds payable to those entities under the Settlement Agreements will be allocated;

WHEREAS, the proposed Addendum to the MOU ("Addendum") provided with this Resolution provides for allocation of settlement proceeds among the Wisconsin Participating Subdivisons according to the same percentages as that provided in the previously-approved MOU allocating the settlement proceeds of the settlements involving McKesson Corporation, Cardinal Health, Inc., AmerisourceBergen Corporation, Johnson & Johnson, Janssen Pharmaceuticals, Inc., Ortho-McNeil-Janssen Pharmaceuticals, Inc., and Janssen Pharmaceutical. Inc.:

WHEREAS, there is provided with this Resolution a summary of the essential terms of the Settlement Agreements, the deadlines related to the effective dates of the Settlement Agreements, the ramifications associated with the County's refusal to enter into the Settlement Agreements, the form of the Addendum, the form of the AG MOU, and an overview of the process for finalizing the Settlement Agreements;

WHEREAS, the County, by this Resolution, shall deposit the proceeds of the Settlement Agreements consistent with the terms of this Resolution and Wis. Stat. § 165.12(4)(b);

WHEREAS, pursuant to the County's engagement agreement with the Law Firms, the County shall pay up to an amount equal to 25% of the proceeds from successful resolution of all or part of the Litigation, whether through settlement or otherwise, plus the Law Firms' costs and disbursements, to the Law Firms as compensation for the Law Firms' efforts in the Litigation and any settlement;

WHEREAS, the Law Firms anticipate making application to the national fee fund established in the Settlement Agreements seeking payment, in whole or part, of the fees, costs, and disbursements owed the Law Firms pursuant to the engagement agreement with the County;

WHEREAS, it is anticipated the amount of any award from the fee fund established in the Settlement Agreements will be insufficient to satisfy the County's obligations under the engagement agreement with the Law Firms;

WHEREAS, the County, by this Resolution, and pursuant to the authority granted the County in the applicable Order emanating from the Litigation in relation to the Settlement Agreements and payment of attorney fees, shall authorize and direct the escrow agent responsible for the receipt and distribution of the proceeds from the Settlement Agreements to establish an account for the purpose of segregating funds to pay the fees, costs, and disbursements of the Law Firms owed by the County (the "Attorney Fees Account") in order to fund a local "backstop" for payment of the fees, costs, and disbursements of the Law Firms;

WHEREAS, in no event shall payments to the Law Firms out of the Attorney Fees Account and the fee fund established in the Settlement Agreements exceed an amount equal to 25% of the amounts allocated to the County in the Addendum;

WHEREAS, the intent of this Resolution is to authorize the County to enter into the Settlement Agreements, the Addendum, and the AG MOU, establish the County's Opioid Abatement Account, and establish the Attorney Fees Account; and

WHEREAS, the County, by this Resolution, shall authorize the County's corporation counsel to finalize and execute any escrow agreement and other document or agreement necessary to effectuate the Settlement

Agreements and the other agreements referenced herein:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: the County Board of Supervisors hereby approves:

- 1. The execution of the Settlement Agreements and any and all documents ancillary thereto and authorizes the County Board Chairman or designee to execute same.
- 2. The final negotiation and execution of the Addendum in form substantially similar to that presented with this Resolution and any and all documents ancillary thereto and authorizes the County Board Chairman or designee to execute same upon finalization provided the percentage share identified as allocated to the County is substantially similar to that identified in the Addendum provided to the Board with this Resolution.
- 3. The final negotiation and execution of the AG MOU in form substantially similar to that presented with this Resolution and any and all documents ancillary thereto and authorizes the County Board Chairman to execute same.
- 4. The execution by the County Board Chairman or designee of any additional documents or agreements for the receipt and disbursement of the proceeds of the Settlement Agreements as referenced in the Addendum.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: all proceeds from the Settlement Agreements not otherwise directed to the Attorney Fees Account shall be deposited in the County's Opioid Abatement Account. The Opioid Abatement Account shall be administered consistent with the terms of this Resolution, Wis. Stat. § 165.12(4), and the Settlement Agreements.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: the County hereby authorizes the establishment of an account separate and distinct from any account containing funds allocated or allocable to the County which shall be referred to by the County as the "Attorney Fees Account." An escrow agent shall deposit a sum equal to up to, but in no event exceeding, an amount equal to 20% of the County's proceeds from the Settlement Agreements into the Attornev Fees Account. If the payments to the County are not enough to fully fund the Attorney Fees Account as provided herein because such payments are made over time, the Attorney Fees Account shall be funded by placing up to, but in no event exceeding, an amount equal to 20% of the proceeds from the Settlement Agreements attributable to Local Governments (as that term is defined in the Allocation MOU) into the Attorney Fees Account for each payment. Funds in the Attorney Fees Account shall be utilized to pay the fees, costs, and disbursements owed to the Law Firms pursuant to the engagement agreement between the County and the Law Firms provided. however, the Law Firms shall receive no more than that to which they are entitled under their fee contract when considering the amounts paid the Law Firms from the fee fund established in the Settlement Agreements and allocable to the County. The Law Firms may make application for payment from the Attorney Fees Account at any time and the County shall cooperate with the Law Firms in executing any documents necessary for the escrow agent to make payments out of the Attorney Fees Account.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all actions heretofore taken by the Board of Supervisors and other appropriate public officers and agents of the County with respect to the matters contemplated under this Resolution are hereby ratified, confirmed and approved.

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF INCREASED COUNTY CHILD SUPPORT FUNDING

WHEREAS, Lafayette County administers the Child Support Enforcement Program on behalf of the state, providing a holistic set of services to Lafayette County children and their parents, including paternity establishment, assistance with finding employment, obtaining child support and establishing health insurance orders for children, and enforcing and modifying those orders; and

WHEREAS, Child support is one of the most effective anti-poverty programs in the state, with county child support agencies serving approximately 347,000 children and collecting roughly \$906 million in financial support for Wisconsin families in 2021; and

WHEREAS, Child support is proven to reduce childhood poverty rates, lead to better educational and behavioral outcomes for children, and have a positive effect on food security, health and housing stability; and

WHEREAS, County child support agencies work closely with both par-

ents to ensure that they have the help they need to be successful, including assistance with finding employment, referrals to other social service programs and right-sizing orders for individuals impacted by substances use disorders or other challenges; and

WHEREAS, State funding for county child support services has failed to keep up with county agency costs, which have steadily increased due to a high number of caseloads per worker, increased complexity of cases, inflation and new regulations; and

WHEREAS, an abrupt federal interpretation change in June 2019 eliminated \$4.2 million in federal birth cost recovery matching funds for Wisconsin: and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin's strong performance in child support is at risk without additional funding. The state has already dropped from 2nd in the nation for the collection of current support in 2016 to 6th in the nation in 2021; and

WHEREAS, without additional state funds, county child support agencies may need to eliminate positions, further increase caseloads, or reduce services, further impacting federal performance measures, which would result in the loss of additional federal funds; and

WHEREAS, the individuals most impacted by insufficient funding for child support are the children and families served by county child support agencies, who will need to seek out public assistance programming absent the financial security provided by the child support program; and

WHEREAS, State investments in child support are amplified by a generous federal match. Every \$1 of state GPR invested in the Child Support Program generates roughly \$2 in federal matching funds; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin's Child Support Enforcement Program is incredibly cost-effective, collecting an average of \$6.43 in support for every dollar invested in the program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Lafayette County Board of Supervisors respectfully requests that state funding for county child support agencies be increased by \$5 million GPR in each fiscal year of the 2023-25 Wisconsin state budget, which will generate approximately \$9.7 million in additional federal funding each year. This investment will ensure that Wisconsin counties can continue to effectively provide economic support to our children; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded by the County Clerk to the Governor of the State of Wisconsin, State Senators and State Representatives representing Lafayette County, the Secretary of the Wisconsin Department of Administration, and the Wisconsin Counties Association, for consideration.
